How did you come up with the idea for Sarge's Saloon?

Lloyd has always dreamed of owning a bar. Over the last decade, we've collected bar equipment, even purchasing the entire contents of three closing businesses in preparation for our future venture. In August 2023, we acquired the former Pour House and transformed it into Sarge's Saloon.

Sarge's is a cozy, welcoming saloon with big plans for expansion, including additional space for more pool tables, a dance floor, and extra room for our patrons. We host live bands, DJs, karaoke, music bingo, rock-paper-scissors tournaments, pool and dart leagues, ladies' nights, and food trucks. Our kitchen offers a small food menu, but we also welcome guests to bring in their own food.

We're open Monday-Thursday from 2 PM to Midnight, Friday and Saturday from 2 PM to 2 AM, and Sundays during football season or for special events. March on down for a shot!

Why did you choose Barton County for your business?

We've both lived in Barton County for over 40 years, and the support and generosity of this community made it the perfect place for our dream to come to life.

Why do you enjoy doing business in Barton County?

The small-town charm and close-knit relationships make Barton County feel like home. We wouldn't want to do this anywhere else!

What inspired you to start your business?

For Lloyd, this has always been a dream. The opportunity finally came, and we knew it was time to make it happen.



Entrepreneurial Mindset Class Wraps Up, Paving the Way for Future and Current Business Owners

The latest session of the Entrepreneurial Mindset class, based on the book Who Owns the Ice House?, has successfully concluded, leaving participants with valuable insights and a renewed perspective on business and problemsolving.


Out of the 11 individuals who enrolled, eight received a 50% refund on their class fees for attending five or more of the six sessions. Participants ranged from current business owners and startups to professionals seeking to apply entrepreneurial thinking in their existing careers.

One of the key components of the class was weekly interviews with local entrepreneurs, where participants had the opportunity to learn firsthand from those who have navigated the challenges of starting and growing a business. These real-life insights helped students connect theory to practice, gaining valuable lessons from business owners who have successfully built their

enterprises.

The final class of 2025 was joined by co-facilitator Jim Correll and Kimberly Becker, both of whom have guided participants through the program's engaging curriculum. Their expertise has helped foster a mindset of innovation, resourcefulness, and resilience among attendees.

For many participants, the class provided not only knowledge but also the motivation to take the next step in



their entrepreneurial journey. As Melinda Harter, one of the newest graduates of the ICE House program, put it: "If you want to get the ball rolling on making your dreams a reality... the Ice House class is a great place to start!"




